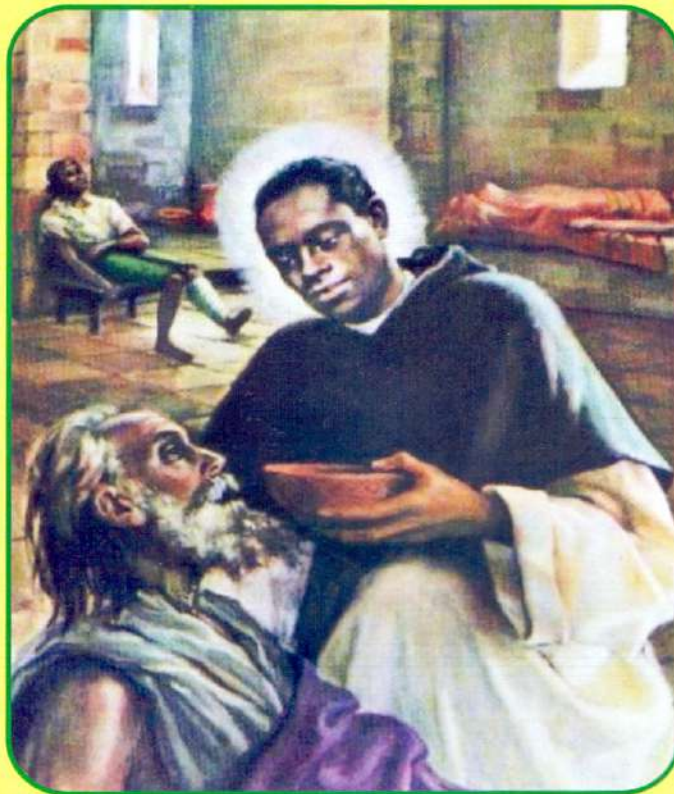

ANNUAL REPORT 2014-2015

INTRODUCTION:

Human Rights is a continuous process, the overall development starting from children to adult is most significant.

38 years of dedicated social services of PMSSS continues to serve and enable the life of the people of Pondicherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore, and Villupuram districts.

PMSSS through its multifaceted approach have reached more than 35883 people directly enabled their life style and standards (Relief – 749, FLS – 15782, Social Assistance – 55, Women Development- 5299, Disability & CBR Mainstreaming – 5079, Agriculture development – 1500, ICT and skill training- 5996, Child protection and development – 1423).

PMSSS have identified and worked for the development of the un reached and un served people who have been pushed into to prey of poor standard of living through its continuous socio economic developmental programmes.

PMSSS has taken several measures not only to promote and strengthen the peoples organization but also to ensure their Right of participation and to integrate the ICT for their skill development through International and National Partners, Govt. Organisations.

Most significantly PMSSS has been recognized by the Govt. Organisations, to impart continuous skill training programme to youth and to enable them for their overall development.

The beneficiaries of the skill training programme mainly youth, adolescent girls, have not only undergone training, but a new perspective have been emerged which enabled them to succeed and lead a better family and social life.

During this year 3 Governing Body meetings and 1 General Body meeting was held with the active participation and the guidance of the members. PMSSS is happy to share the activities implemented during the financial year 2014-2015.

PMSSS Programmes and Activities

Tsunami Decennial Remembrance Program

Caritas India along with Caritas Internationalis Network undertook massive Relief, Rehabilitation and Development interventions immediately after the occurrence of Tsunami Disaster on 26th December 2004, which devastated the coastal regions of Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry, Andhra, Kerala and Andaman. Ten years have passed, still one cannot forget the misery of huge life and property loss happened to the families of the coastal communities.

Caritas and Diocesan Social Service Societies in all the affected regions reached out to the distressed people and extended their helping hand in many ways. The interventions of Caritas definitely enabled and empowered the coastal communities over the period of these ten years.

In order to remember and pay tribute to the people who had lost their life and to revisit the Caritas Humanitarian service interventions to work out strategies for facing the challenges in any future disaster occurrence, a two day conference namely Tsunami Decennial Remembrance Program was organized at Pondicherry on 5th and 6th of March 2015

Caritas India sponsored and organized this event and PMSSS hosted the program along with SAMSSS, TASOSS and other diocesan social service societies in Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Andhra. The first day event was presided over by Rt. Rev. Lumen Monterio, Chairman, Caritas India and the program was inaugurated by Most Rev. Dr. Anthony Anandarayar, Archbishop of Pondicherry & Cuddalore. A study report undertaken by Indian Social Institute was presented and there were regional wise experience – sharing and discussions held on Housing, livelihood and Disaster Risk Reduction components. Around 175 people participated in the first day event.

Later at ST. Antony's Community Hall, Puducherry a public function was organized having Hon'ble Chief Minister of Puducherry Thiru. N. Rangasamy as Chief Guest and Presided over by His Eminence Baselios Cardinal Cleemis, President, CBCI in the presence of Most Rev. Dr. Antony Anandarayar, Archbishop of Pondicherry, Most Rev. Dr. George Anthonysamy, Archbishop of Madras- Mylapore, Rt. Rev. Dr. Devadoss Ambrose, Bishop of Thanjavur, Ret. Rev. Jose Chittooparambil, Bishop of Rajkot, Direct and Assistant Director of Caritas India, Mr. Peter Seidel, Caritas Germany, Mr. Tony Castleman, Country Director, CRS and other officials from IGSSS, CRS, FVTRS, Directors, Diocesan Directors, Staff and beneficiaries from 3 Regional Forum of Andhra, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and other Northern States in India. The second day event was attended by 300 people. An exhibition also was organized to depict the tsunami activities carried out by the DSSS in different regions. The second day event of civic function witnessed the presence of stakeholders from International and National community to share their perspective and experiences and forge a road map of moving forward.

Caritas Internationalis observed the 10th Anniversary of occurrence of tsunami disaster in Srilanka organizing a special event. The program was conducted during 5th, 6th and 7th of December 2014. In order to represent India, joining with Caritas India team and to represent PMSSS the Executive Director of PMSSS, General Manager and Finance Executive participated in the program in Srilanka. PMSSS ICT intervention of Ocean information dissemination services in partnership with INCOIS and ISRO and disaster mitigation program activities presented to the forum got appreciation from the representatives of Caritas Internationalis.

Fraternal Life Communities

PMSSS through leadership training formed rural based credit unions namely Fraternal Life Communities to promote fraternity and unity. The village level FLCs are federated into 10 zonal federations and promoted at the diocesan level as Fraternal Life Sabha (FLS). The FLCs are engaged in mobilizing savings from members and granting loans to the members from their savings, undertake micro enterprise, self employment, Income Generation and Life Insurance etc for their well being and develop their socio economic status.

Death Claim: During this year death claim to the tune of Rs. 3,75,000 received from LIC for 11 members and given to their family members.

Special Activity:

Soil testing has been conducted freely with the help of Murugappa Research Centre, Chennai for 97 farmers of Viriyur Vicariate. The value of the activity amounts to Rs. 1,74,600.

Sago Dharma Sabha

Social Assistance programme was intended to rehabilitate the aged and elders who have been abandoned by their own family members, relatives, society. The programme continues to serve the needy and the poor through the continuous contribution from Educational Institutions, Parish Priests, and staff of PMSSS.

- During this year 165 aged were facilitated to receive govt. pensions.
- 55 beneficiaries received assistance to the tune of Rs. 66,000
- 45 aged members passed away during this year.

Community Health Program

The project aims at helping the poor sick people in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore to avail medical care for the cure. The services of the program are extended to people from other diocese too.

- Patients are identified through the Parish Priests and Village Heads and they were referred to hospital for treatment and cure.
- Medical test are done and Medicines distributed on need basis.
- Patients are facilitated to avail concession if treatment is done in private hospitals.
- Medical counseling done on need basis.
- Food and TA are provided to patients during their treatment period.
- Free arrangements were made for patients requiring MRI, CT scan and ECG in Govt. and Jipmer Hospitals.
- Accommodation facilities are arranged for distress patients.

TB Control Program:

TB forum formed in the district of Cuddalore in which NGO representatives and members of Lions Club have been inducted for the welfare of the patients suffering from TB and to work for TB free district.

PMSSS and TB control Institute, Puducherry have jointly initiated to collect sputum samples from 9 Sub centres in Puducherry. The collected samples are presented for testing. A total 1257 samples have been tested in which 32 persons are identified with TB are given DOTS tablets.

CHAP:

Catholic Association of Pondicherry (CHAP) is functioning in collaboration with CHAT having 30 members. Every year Governing Body meeting is conducted at regular intervals. In this year 4 Governing Body meetings were held. During this meeting training on Alternate Medicine, Acupuncture and Medication was conducted.

In the month of January 2015, Training on Strategy Planning was conducted for CHAP members and Sisters of the Religious Congregations. During this training programme, awareness on TB, collection and transportation of Sputum in Villupuram district was discussed. Very Rev. Fr. A. Arulanandam, Vicar General of Pondicherry and Cuddalore Archdiocese, Rev. Fr. V. Albert Thambidurai, Health Committee Secretary and Chairman, CHAP, Rev. Fr. Mathew, Health Coordinator, Dr. Summo, CBCI, CORD RNTCP coordinator, District TB Control Officer, Rev. Sr. Siriyapushpam, President CHAT and Rev. Fr. Jothi, Vice President, CHAT were present.

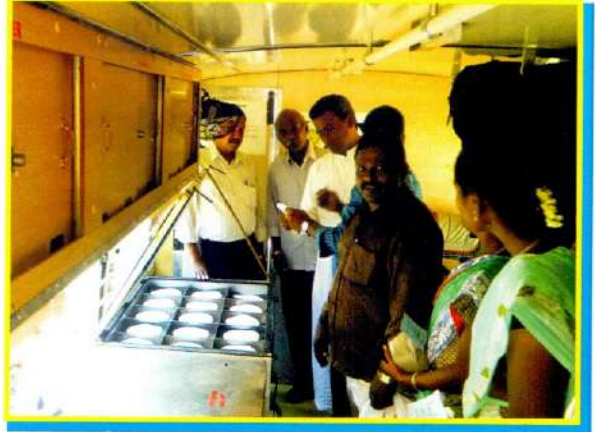

New Thrust Program

The New Thrust Program (NTP) started functioning since 1999 in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry, coordinated by Tamil Nadu Social Service Society (TASOSS). The program aims at transforming women in distress situation to become self reliant and self sustaining people's empowered movement on Right Based Approaches and Livelihood Enhancement for social transformation.

Aims:

1. To Increase savings and the activities of the members and to Mobilize resources from the Govt.
2. To sensitize Federation Leaders on Management Skills and Human Rights Approaches.
3. To enable Federation Leaders themselves to plan, implement activities and manage the groups.
4. To make Peoples organization to be recognized by legal entity and the society.
5. To enable the groups to take more initiatives for their own development.
6. To Network and link with the Govt and Non Governmental Organisations.
7. To mobilize resources for the development of their villages.
8. To make the groups to acquire knowledge on ICT, Monitoring and Documentation skills.
9. To network with the like minded organizations in the district and the state level.
10. To identify and address issues.

2. Women have enrolled their family members and the PWDs in their groups.
3. Resolutions passed to reduce the administrative charges and to increase the EMI for the loan given to PWDs.
4. 400 Puducherry CBO Members and 450 Cuddalore CBO members of NTP coordinated and participated in the International Women's Day in which PWDs were given assistance.

CBO Members in JBY:

7233 members have enrolled in LIC's JBY Scheme.

Death Claim:

Death claim to the tune of Rs. 4,35,000 was received for the deceased members of Annagramam, Panruti, Cuddalore, Kurinjipadi, Puducherry and Ozhukarai Unions.

Kolping Program

Kolping programme was started with an objective to promote spiritual, social, economic, political, cultural values and savings among youth groups in the Archdiocese. Kolping groups and members have realized their roles and responsibilities in promoting social cause for the betterment of self, family and society.

The program has promoted 79 Kolping family groups with 1526 members, federated into 5 groups and mobilized savings to the tune of Rs.1,51,75,600.

- Under the Collective IGP, 11 members received economic assistance through which Provision stores and Goat rearing is undertaken.
- Under Milch Animal Programme 5 members of Sagayapuram have received an economic assistance to the tune of Rs. 15,000 and another 5 members of Akkarapalayam have received an economic assistance of Rs. 15,000 and involved in selling milk through which they are earning an average monthly income of Rs. 3000.
- Under Housing Construction Programme, members of Noorolai, Melpazhanganur, Serathanur villages have constructed houses.
- Under Vocational Skill Training Educational Assistance, Members of Keezhsathapattu, Noorolai, Irudayampattu, have availed loan for educational assistance for their children.

Trainings and Workshop:

Kolping India have been continuously imparting awareness and training to their members on Group Management, Leadership skills, Social issues, which enables them to move ahead to the next level.

Achievement of Kolping Movement:

- Under the Milch animal Programme, Tmt. Amalavijayarani, Sirumalar Kolping Group of Viriyur has been earning Rs. 160 per day by selling milk and she has admitted her children in English Medium Private School.
- Sangeetha Mary, D/o Tmt. Viyagula Mary of Annai Theresa Kolping Group of Vazhuthalampet, was not able to continue her studies after completing 12th Std. Under VTP program educational loan was provided and now she is working in Annai Hospital, Kurinjipadi with a monthly salary of Rs. 4500.

Impacts:

- Federations promoted in the villages have been holding regular monthly meetings in which development of groups and members are focused.
- Resolutions are passed in favour of promoting and developing the Spiritual, Social, Economic aspects and Group dynamism in the Quarterly meeting of the Vicariate Federations.

CBR Mainstreaming Program

The programme aimed at liberating the PWDs socially, spiritually, economically from the Physical and attitudinal barriers and to ensure equality, justice, equal standards in the family and the society.

Implemented Activities:

- 811 PWDs have been identified from the selected 20 parishes.
- Suggestions received to orient about CBR-MS to the Secretaries and staff of the Diocesan Commissions of the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore.
- Suggestions received to orient about CBR-MS to the Congregation sisters.
- Training on CBR- MS of children with disability to school teachers of the Archdiocese.
- Activities implemented by the Core committee of the Parish and the spiritual association are reviewed
- Loans provided to PWDs to promote self employment.
- Staff participated in the 3 days Training on Monitoring and Evaluation organized by the CBR Forum. Executive Director and staff members participated in the partners meeting and submitted the reports.
- Monitoring visit by CBR Forum to assess the situation, changes and the development.
- PWDs participated in the Job Mela organized by Social Welfare Department, Puducherry.
- Two years action plan prepared and submitted to CBR Forum in the Reflection workshop.
- Vicar General and Executive Directors from Chattisgarh Diocese made an exposure visit and learnt the process of implementation of CBR-MS.
- PWDs participated in the district level International Day of Disabled Persons celebration.

Impacts:

- Participation of PWDs in church and Spiritual activities increased.
- Special Mass conducted for the PWDs yearly once.
- PWDs are encouraged to perform in cultural programmes organized at the district level.
- Ramps constructed in 2 parishes of Karaikal for PWDs.
- Separate queue for the PWDs in the Hospitals set up after continuous advocacy by the PWDs.
- Monthly pensions are given after continuous demonstration.
- PWDs got job in the Job Mela organized by PMSSS and NI-MSME
- 76 PWDs have received aids and appliances.
- 14 PWDs SHG group promoted with 105 members in which 28 PWDs have been elected as President and Secretaries.
- 16 PWDs have become members in the spiritual associations.

Home for the Mentally Ill

FLSH has been designed as a transit home where people with mental illness are admitted, given treatment in Pondicherry General Hospital and Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education and Research (JIPMER), and sent back to their home once they become normal. FLSH continues

to function with the donations received in cash and kind from individual philanthropist and govt. departments.

FLSH is the only home available within the district of Pondicherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts of Tamil Nadu for the rehabilitation of the mentally ill. The home continuously provide medical care, love and concern to more than 2100 mentally ill persons of which 1500 persons are living a better life. During this year for more than 52 persons have been given treatment and benefited.

USHA Sillai School

PMSSS signed MoU with USHA International to start Sillai(Tailoring) Schools in Puducherry and Villupuram Districts with an objective to identify the distressed women and to enhance their livelihood options through Tailoring Skills.

Puducherry District:

- USHA sillai School teachers continue to train and impart tailoring skills to students. During this year 489 students have been trained and Certificates distributed.
- Tailoring machine worth Rs. 4800 was purchased by 15 students.

Villupuram District:

- 284 students have completed the course and yet to be given certificates.
- Tailoring machine worth Rs. 4800 was purchased by 7 students.

Achievement:

Mrs. Matildamary one of the beneficiary of the USHA project have received best USHA teacher award by USHA in Villupuram District.

TOT training:

During the month of February 2015 teachers were selected for TOT training in which 10 teachers (Puducherry – 5 and Villupuram – 5) who were beneficiaries of the USHA project got selected as TOT to impart tailoring skills in the both the districts in the future.

Monitoring Visit:

On 13.06.2014, Mr. Vadivelu, Monitoring officer, USHA International visited USHA Sillai schools in Villupuram and assessed the functioning of the schools.

Special Monitoring visit:

Mr. Rajeshvarma, and Mr. Vadivelu from USHA International visited USHA Sillai schools in Puducherry and interacted with the teachers and assessed their status. USHA International have given good feedback to PMSSS Director and discussed about the way forward of the schools.

Impacts:

With the implementation of the USHA project the women are able to increase their confidence level, able to contribute to the family economically, give their children a better education, enabled them to become trainers and recognized in the community.

Child Development Project

PMSSS has partnered with Childfund India to implement Child Development Project since October 2014 with an objective to support child education, health and hygiene, awareness to parents, and livelihood enhancement of parents of the sponsored children. 536 children in the age group starting from 6 years to 24 years are the direct beneficiaries of the project who are mostly sponsored by International Donors for their education. The donors send money and share their wishes on important events, festivals with the child. The project is implemented in the following villages.

In House Training:

3 days in house training was conducted for the project staff about the project concepts. Mr. Sathish, Zonal Manager, Mr. Azhagarsamy, Zonal Finance Officer, Mrs. Devaki, Sponsor Relation Officer, Mr. Manikandan Kumar, Monitoring and Evaluation Officer from Childfund India trained the participants.

Child Verification:

The details of the 536 Children and their families were rechecked and updated. Individual files maintained for each children.

Child Resource Centre:

10 child resource centres have been identified and ready to equip with reading, sports material, tailoring machine, computers to provide awareness and training to children and women.

Birthday Celebration:

82 children have celebrated their birthday starting from February 2015. The project staff visits the children house and celebrates their birthday with cakes, gifts, greetings card signed by the Director, PMSSS. Parents of the children have appreciated this event.

Distribution of School Bags:

229 children in the age group of 6 - 14 have been issued school bags and story books in Tamil and English.

Guidance for Exams:

145 children studying 10th std., and 74 children studying 12th std., were given guidance to face the public exams with guidance. Educational materials were distributed to children to encourage them to write exams.

Eye Camp:

54 children participated in the eye camp organized by PMSSS in association with Aravind Eye Hospital in which 10 children found with eye sight problems given spectacles.

Dermatology, Dental and General Medical camp:

PMSSS and Arupadaiveedu Medical College and Hospital conducted medical camps in which 116 children benefitted. 47 children with medical complaints were treated and cured.

CBO Meeting:

CBO meetings in 14 villages were conducted in which 441 women participated and got oriented about the program concepts.

Monthly meeting with staff:

Every month review and planning meeting is conducted to review and plan the activities that are targeted for implementation.

Information and Communication Technology

In the year 2005 as a pilot project PMSSS started ICT as tool for people's development. Through technology Disaster Preparedness, E-Medicine, E-learning, E-Legal Aid Services, E-Agriculture programs are conducted in collaboration with Government and private institutions.

Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) :

In order to know about Sea wave height, wave direction, wind speed and direction INCOIS, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Hyderabad deployed Wave Rider Buoy at Pondicherry sea shore. The information from

BUOY is recorded at PMSSS head quarters through VHF antenna fixed in the Wave Rider Buoy and also in PMSSS office. This information are disseminated through Local TV channels, SMS network. Now PMSSS is in process to disseminate the information in News papers.

Village Resource Center (VRC):

PMSSS in collaboration with Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) established 6 Village Resource Center (Thavalakuppam, Cuddalore OT, Vadalur, Periyapattu, Nedungadu and Villupuram) and one Hub center (Pondicherry) to implement technology oriented programs for the development of rural community. ISRO announced PMSSS as Expert Center, through satellite connectivity we can conduct Tele-Education, Tele-Medicine, Tele-agriculture programs and people can collect information on Land and Water Resource on their areas. Also PMSSS is conducting Tailoring, Typewriting and computer training on all the VRCs.

Skill Development Centre :

On implementing Technological intervention programs in the working area of PMSSS, its noted that there is a big gap between the educated unemployed youth and the employer.

Even the youth are completing their graduation and post graduation, they are not able to find a job and the employers have vacancies, but they are not able to identify skilled persons.

To minimize this gap between the unemployed and the employer, PMSSS decided to organize Skill development program to employ the unemployed youths. Now, PMSSS has tie up with below mentioned State and Central Government Institutions.

NABARD :

National Agricultural Bank for Rural Development (NABARD), Under Ministry of Rural Development has sponsored 13days Micro Enterprises Development Program (MEDP) in Bridal Blouse & Saree painting and Cosmetology & Beautician for 60 Self Help Group Members in Vadalur area. Most of them are now doing Self Employment.

NI-MSME :

National Institute for Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, Hyderabad under Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, Govt. of India in collaboration with PMSSS conducting Entrepreneurship Skill Development Program for the unemployed youth and women in Pondicherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore and Villupuram. 30 students enrolled in each batch. Those who are willing to go for Job or start Self Employment only enrolled in this ESDP program.

In 2014, September 240 youth were trained, certificate distribution function was organized at PMSSS conference hall on 24-12-2014. Thiru. R. Radhakrishnan, Member of Parliament, Puducherry, distributed the certificates in the presence of Dr.G.U.K. Rao, Director, School of Enterprise, NI-MSME, Hyderabad and Thiru. J. KoteswaraRao, Program Director, School of Enterprise, NI-MSME, Hyderabad.

In 2015 January, NIMSME signed an agreement with PMSSS for a period of One year to train more unemployed youth. After the agreement NIMSME has sanctioned training for 660 youth and the courses are given below.

In 2015, February National Institute of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (NI-MSME) - Hyderabad in association with PMSSS conducted Talent Mela ie., JOB MELA at St. Joseph's Collage of Arts and Science at Cuddalore District. Students who completed Higher Secondary, ITI, Diploma, Degree, BE, B.tech candidates participated in this JOB MELA. Different companies from various sectors recruited more than 400 candidates. Appointment orders were distributed to the selected candidates by Thiru. J. KoteswaraRao, Program Director, School of Enterprise, NI-MSME, Hyderabad in the presence of Mr. Rajaganesh, Manager, DIC, Mr. Rajagopalan, AGM, NABARD.

In continuation of that, March-2015 a JOB MELA organized at Pope John Paul II College of Education , Pondicherry. Out of 1347 candidates 428 got placement. Appointment orders were distributed to the selected candidates by Mr. Paneer Selvam, Minister for Social Welfare, in the presence of Dr. Vallaba Reddy, Chief Executive Officer, NIMSME, Hyderabad, Mr. Parameswaran, LDM, Indian Bank, Puducherry, Mr. Agilan, Director, INDSET, Puducherry, Mr. Karthikeyan, HR Manager, Lenovo, Puducherry.

National Digital Literacy Mission (NDLM):

NASSCOM Foundation in collaboration with PMSSS conducted Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) training for the rural youth and organized placement. As a pilot project of NDLM-Computer Skills for all, NASSCOM Foundation organized Computer Training program at PMSSS for 180 youth. Online Exam was conducted for the trainees and all got passed in the exam.

National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC):

In 2013, PMSSS in collaboration with LAQSH JOB Skills Academy, Bangalore conducted NSDC – STAR scheme in schools and colleges. 2013-2014, 1420 youth were trained and in 2014-2015, 2501 student were trained. Out of 3921 students, 91% got passed and certified by NSDC and Sector Skill Council with award money of Rs. 1000. PMSSS got best partner award from LAQSH JOBS Skill Academy, Bangalore.

PMSSS got Permanent Number in Aajeevika Skill Development Program. Now PMSSS can implement the Central Government supported Skill development program all over India.

INDSETI :

Indian Bank Self Employment Training Institute (INDSETI) in collaboration with PMSSS conducting Free Skill Training Program to the Rural youth. In 2014, Tally training was given, 60% of them got placement.

Modular Employability Skills (MES) :

PMSSS is in process with Labor Department, Puducherry to provide skill education for schools and college students. PMSSS centers are registered with Skill Development Program. Process has taken to verify PMSSS Training Centers.

IFAD Assisted PTSLP

Post Tsunami Sustainable Livelihood program is implemented with the support of International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Rome in 3 clusters comprising of 17 panchayat and 91 villages of Parangipettai and Kumaratchi Taluk of Cuddalore District through District Rural Development Agency and Tamil Nadu Corporation for Development of Women. The program promoted 203 SHG.

Activities:

Training on Micro Enterprise Development, Income Generation Activity and Life Insurance Corporation of India, Availing Bank loan for the 203 SHG in 17 panchayat have been conducted successfully.

Training/ Activities:

1. Pit construction worth Rs. 5000 each for Asola cultivation was constructed for 21 persons.
2. Solar layer worth Rs. 3,25,000 and Mixer machine worth Rs. 75000 was distributed.
3. 15 persons were given training on Humas preparations worth Rs. 22500.
4. Murungai cultivation promoted and the produce are sold and exported. Rs. 35 per kg of fresh leaves, Rs. 150 per kg of dried leaves, Rs. 350-500 per kg of Murungai powder are sold in the market.

Block Disability Mitigation Rehabilitation and Facilitating Agency Program

BDMRFA program has been implemented with the support of TNSRLM for the livelihood development of differently abled persons and vulnerable people living below the poverty line. PMSSS has been appointed as Block Disability Mitigation and Facilitating Agency for 4 blocks of Cuddalore district under the guidance and facilitation of the Block Development Officers. In each village Special Group Facilitator is appointed to identify the needs and facilitate the PWDs.

Trainings:

1. 11 days training for Program Managers organized in TNSRLM.
2. 6 days Training for Project coordinators was conducted on project concepts.
3. 11 days training for village level staff was conducted for 230 persons.
4. TOT training attended by 2 project staff.
5. 18 staff participated in the Situational analysis training.

Program activities:

- In November 2014 PMSSS and District Rehabilitation office, Cuddalore organized a rally on reducing disability.
- In the month of December 2014 PMSSS and Primary health Centre, Villupuram organized a rally on Eradication of Dengu and Malaria.
- 1700 PWDs participated in the rally to provide preference to PWDs in employment opportunities.

Identification/Medical camps:

- In the month of January to March 2015 camps organized to identify disabled persons, assess the needs, facilitation to avail Disabled pension, OAP, was conducted in 97 villages of Kammapuram and Panruti Blocks of Cuddalore district and in 123 villages of Gingee and Vanur Blocks of Villupuram Districts.
- Medical camps conducted for the social auditing groups in Cuddalore and Villupuram districts.

Program Activities:

Open House programme:

On 02.08.2014, Open house programme was organized by CHILDLINE Puducherry in Shakthinagar. Child rights club formed with facilitation of CHILDLINE Puducherry identified issues and submitted a petition to their constituency Member of Legislative Assembly. MLA during the programme appreciated the efforts of CHILDLINE and children for bring out the issue to his notice. He also assured that all the issues mentioned in the petition will be taken up seriously and will be solved. Children performed skit, cultural programme on child rights and protection. Around 150 children and residents of Sakthi Nagar participated.

On 14.03.2015 Open house programme was organized in Vazhaikulam area in which the Child Welfare Committee Chairperson was invited as Chief Guest. The issues affecting children was presented to the Chair Person.

Observation of Anti child labour day:

On 12th June 2014, CHILDLINE Puducherry observed Anti Child Labour Day with 100 Community Service Scheme students of Govt. School in puducherry. The campaign was organised in MaraiMalai Adigalsalai near New bus stand. A few of the students dressed themselves as child labourers working in Workshop, Hotels, Construction, Eateries and tea stall with eyes covered with red ribbon Children caught the attention of the public. The students during the campaign raised slogans against employing children in work, took pledge to support children employed and inform CHILDLINE.

Orientation programme for Child Care Institutions:

On 12.08.2014 a Sensitization Programme was organized by CHILDLINE Puducherry for the Incharges of CCIs of Puducherry. Deputy Director, DSW inaugurated the programme and stressed the need of registration of homes under JJ act is compulsory, all children should be produced before CWC for Care and protection and children below 5 years should be sent to adoption homes. CWC chairperson, HOPE NGO Director, and Collab NGO Director felicitated.

43 persons from 39 Institutions participated. Mr. Kanniyaram, Former Field Officer, Department of Social Defense handled the sessions and covered topics on Minimum standards of CCIs, child friendly guidelines and procedures mentioned in JJ act and POCSO act.

At the end of the programme, CHILDLINE Puducherry reminded about formation of Home Management Committee, Installation of Complaint boxes and Child Protection Policy for Institution should be framed and displayed at the earliest.

Participants expressed that they learnt the need of providing child friendly spaces within the institutions, procedure and guidelines are very useful. They also thanked CHILDLINE for the soft copy of the materials and assured to make use of it.

Sensitization programme on Child Rights and Protection for Anganwadi Teachers:

CHILDLINE Puducherry organized sensitization camp for anganwadi teachers of puducherry district. The programme inaugurated by Smt. Padma, Programme officer, Department of Women and Child Development in the presence of Collab Director. More than 500 teachers split into 3 batches were orientated about child rights and protection and role of Anganwadi teachers in ensuring the development of children.

The anganwadi teachers assured to support Childline services and report cases of child rights violation within their locality.

Special Events:

Campaign against child marriage:

On 27th April 2014 CHILDLINE Puducherry organised a Campaign against child marriage. Due to recent rise in child marriage case reported to 1098 and intervened by CHILDLINE. A campaign was organized in Puducherry to educate the common people about preventing child marriage and how this menace affecting the girl children less than 18 years. The campaign programme was organised in beach road, in front of Gandhi Statue (one of the prominent tourist spot). The children wore mask holding pluck cards containing message about prevention, protection, ill effects of child marriage and the need of educating girl children. CHILDLINE able to reach around 200 persons during this campaign.

Campaign against Child Abuse:

On 01.08.2014, a campaign against child abuse was organized by CHILDLINE Puducherry to create awareness to general masses about protecting child and preventing child abuse. 100 students of Community Service Scheme of a private govt. aided school participated in the campaign. Physical abuse, child trafficking, sexual abuse, begging, child labour, child marriage themes were depicted by children to create awareness to protect children and treat like humans.

Observation of International Day against Drug Abuse & Illicit Trafficking:

On 26th June Childline observed International Day against Drug abuse & Illicit Trafficking in Govt. High School. Senior Superintendent of Police (L&O) chaired the occasion and took oath against Drug abuse and Illicit Trafficking.

Orientation Programme on legal aspects of child related cases:

One day Orientation Programme was jointly organized by Union Territory of Puducherry Legal Aid Services Authority (UTPLSA) and CHILDLINE Puducherry for 35 CHILDLINE staff of Puducherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore, Villupuram and Nagapatinam. The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Abdul Rachide, Duty Council, UTPLSA, Tmt. Marie Anna Dayavady, Duty Council, Women clinic, UTPLSA in the presence of Collab Director. The participants learnt about the procedure for filing FIR, Chargesheet, Trail and bail process, and shared cases intervened by CHILDLINE and got clarified.

UTPLSA assured to provide legal support for child related cases intervened by CHILDLINE.

CSD Campaign:

Press Meet:

On 13.11.2014 CHILDLINE Puducherry organized a Press meet and invited print and video media from puducherry. The centre coordinator listed out the calls and cases intervened during the year 2011- 2014. Later the CSD campaign schedule was shared with the media for giving coverage of events planned.

CSD Campaign Inauguration:

On 14.11.2014 CHILDLINE staff along with 60 children went to the Legislative Assembly, met the Chief Minister of Puducherry, shared children day wishes with him and tied the dosti band. Some of the children came out with a smile by raising their hands with the tied dosti band by the Chief Minister.

Procession led by popular cartoon characters and Cultural Team:

On 15.11.2014 a procession through 2 dolls (famous cartoon characters, Mickey Mouse and Chota Beam) along with a traditional cultural team was organized in Anna Statue. The procession was kick started by the Education Minister by dialing 1098 hold by one of the doll and flagged off the procession.

The doll and the cultural team along with 60 children moved along the important commercial streets like Anna Salai, JN Street, Mahatma Gandhi Street, and ended in Laporte Street.

CHILDLINE 1098 programme aired in Hello FM:

On 15.11.2014 a programme on CHILDLINE 1098 was aired in Hello FM from 8.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m in Hello Tamizha and other programmes. A prerecorded programme compered by the centre coordinator spoke about the services of CHILDLINE project.

Screening of CHILDLINE Films and CSD campaign decorated in boat docked near Gandhi Statue:

A mass level programme of Screening of CHILDLINE Films brought by CIF was organized before Gandhi Statue in beach road, one of the prominent tourist spot was inaugurated by the Welfare Minister on 16.11.2014. Films like Life Lessons including KOMAL, THE ROSE, LIKE SISTERS, EDUCATION COUNTS were screened before more than 300 audiences gathered there. Before the start of the programme, a boat in which "CSD Campaign 2014 CHILDLINE 1098" was decorated with LED lighting was made to sail along the coast to attract and to create awareness about CHILDLINE for the tourist and the common masses in the beach.

Day out programme to Chunnabaru Boat House:

On 17.11.2014 around 70 children from shelter homes were taken to chunnabaru boat house for a day out programme. The programme was flagged off by the Chairman, Puducherry Tourism Development Corporation. Children sailed in a big boat with the life jackets, spent the day with joy and fun playing in the shore and the mud in the paradise island.

Display of CHILDLINE activities in Exhibition organized by Information and Broadcasting Department:

A Three day exhibition programme from 17th to 19th November 2014, was organized by Information and Broadcasting Department, New Delhi. Various Govt. Departments displayed their schemes in the stalls. CHILDLINE puducherry was given an opportunity by Social Welfare Department to display CHILDLINE activities. IEC materials, banners were displayed along with the Social Welfare Department Schemes. CHILDLINE notices were distributed to the visitors.

Cultural and Prize distribution programme:

On 18.11.2014 a Cultural and Prize Distribution Programme was organized in Community Hall, Karikalampakkam, children showcased their talents on dance, Tamil Elocution, and Singing. The prizes were distributed by the Chairman, Pondicherry Engineering College.

Releasing of Poster and Pledge against Child Marriage:

On 19.11.2014 a programme on Releasing of CHILDLINE Poster and Pledge against Child Marriage was organized in Immaculate Heart of Mary Higher Secondary School, Puducherry. The Education Minister unveiled the Poster and read out the Pledge in which more than 200 students participated and took pledge against Child Marriage on account of International Day for Prevention of Child Abuse.

Poster Sticking Campaign:

On 20.11.2014 CHILDLINE staff marched towards Temple, Schools, Marriage Halls and in other important Public Places to stick the Poster released by CIF.

Networking and Monitoring Visits:

During this year two networking and monitoring visit by CHILDLINE India Foundation was done to assess the function and status of the CHILDLINE project in the district of Puducherry. Ms. Jenshiya Priyanka, City Incharge (CIC) and Mr. Subin Scaria, CIC, visited PMSSS in the month of July 2014 and January 2015.

Outcomes:

- 18 child sexual abuse cases intervened, FIR filed and the accused remanded to judicial custody.
- 5 Child Sexual Abuse cases are identified through awareness in schools.
- 5 Child Marriage reported and marriage stopped.
- 5 physical cases and 4 child labour cases reported and intervened.
- Out of 427 cases, 188 cases (44%) are intervened through outreach and remaining 239 cases (56%) are reported through 1098 toll free.
- 20 Children reenrolled in schools.
- 2 Abandoned babies provided required shelter facilities.

Case Studies:**Child Sexual Abuse: 1*****Contact with CHILDLINE***

On 21.03.2015 after an awareness programme in school, the child approached the Childline Team Member and informed that she was been sexually abused by a person aged 59 for more than 4 years.

CHILDLINE Intervention

On 25.03.2015 Childline Team Member along with DCPS staff obtained a written statement from the child. On 26.03.2015 the information was given to the parents and asked them to present before CWC and the child was admitted in shelter home on the same day. On 28.03.2015 FIR filed and the abuser was arrested and remanded to judicial custody. On 29.03.2015 the child was admitted in Hospital for medical examination.

Present Status of the Child

The child is at present in her home along with her parents and completed 8th Std., and waiting for result.

Child Sexual abuse case: 2**Contact with CHILDLINE**

On 27.01.2015 an ex CHILDLINE office staff found a girl child standing in Pondicherry new bus stand and informed 1098 to intervene and to provide the required support.

Background of the Child

The child aged around 17 years and a school dropout and both her parents expired since her childhood. She along with her younger brother were taken care by their father's younger brother. The child was staying in hostel and studying in a private school. During every vacation the child used to stay in her uncle house.

CHILDLINE Intervention

After the receipt of the information, the CHILDLINE staff rushed to the bus stand and interacted with the child. During the intervention, the child disclosed that she is not willing to stay in her uncle house and was searching for a safe shelter, since her uncle was continuously abusing her sexually since the age of 12. After informing the Protection Officer, UTSCPS the child was provided shelter support temporarily in Kirubalaya Home. After informing the case to CWC, statement was obtained from the child and FIR was filed. Later after the legal formalities the abuser was arrested under POCSO act and remanded to judicial custody on 21.02.2015. Later child was given counseling and guidance.

The child reenrolled in school and staying in the shelter home.

Livelihood Training Centre

In partnership with ConferenzaEpiscopaleItaliana (CEI) PMSSS continued to extend the livelihood support and conducted various trainings to the target beneficiaries belonging to dobbies, cobblers, ottars, irulars and agricultural coolies. In order to give vocational training to the target population a new livelihood training center was constructed at PMSSS agricultural farm in Periyakalapet. The new training center building inauguration was held on February 9th 2015. The new training center was blessed and inaugurated by the President of PMSSS, His Grace the Archbishop in the presence of Hon'ble Minister, Mr. N.G. PannerSelvam, Kalapet MLA, Mr. Kalyana sundaram, diocesan priests, beneficiaries and staff. The CEI New training center has been planned and construed for conducting trainings and as well to hold community common functions.

Skill Development Training Centre

In partnership with Caritas Trevisio, Italy PMSSS constructing a new training center in the office premises of PMSSS for the purpose of holding skill development trainings to benefit poor rural youth and women for their career development. The building construction is in progress and nearing completion. The training center will be a valuable asset through promotion of skill trainings and creating good linkage with both State and Central Government agencies.

- To encourage members of CBO's and beneficiaries of Different PMSSS Projects to be partners through their participation and contribution.

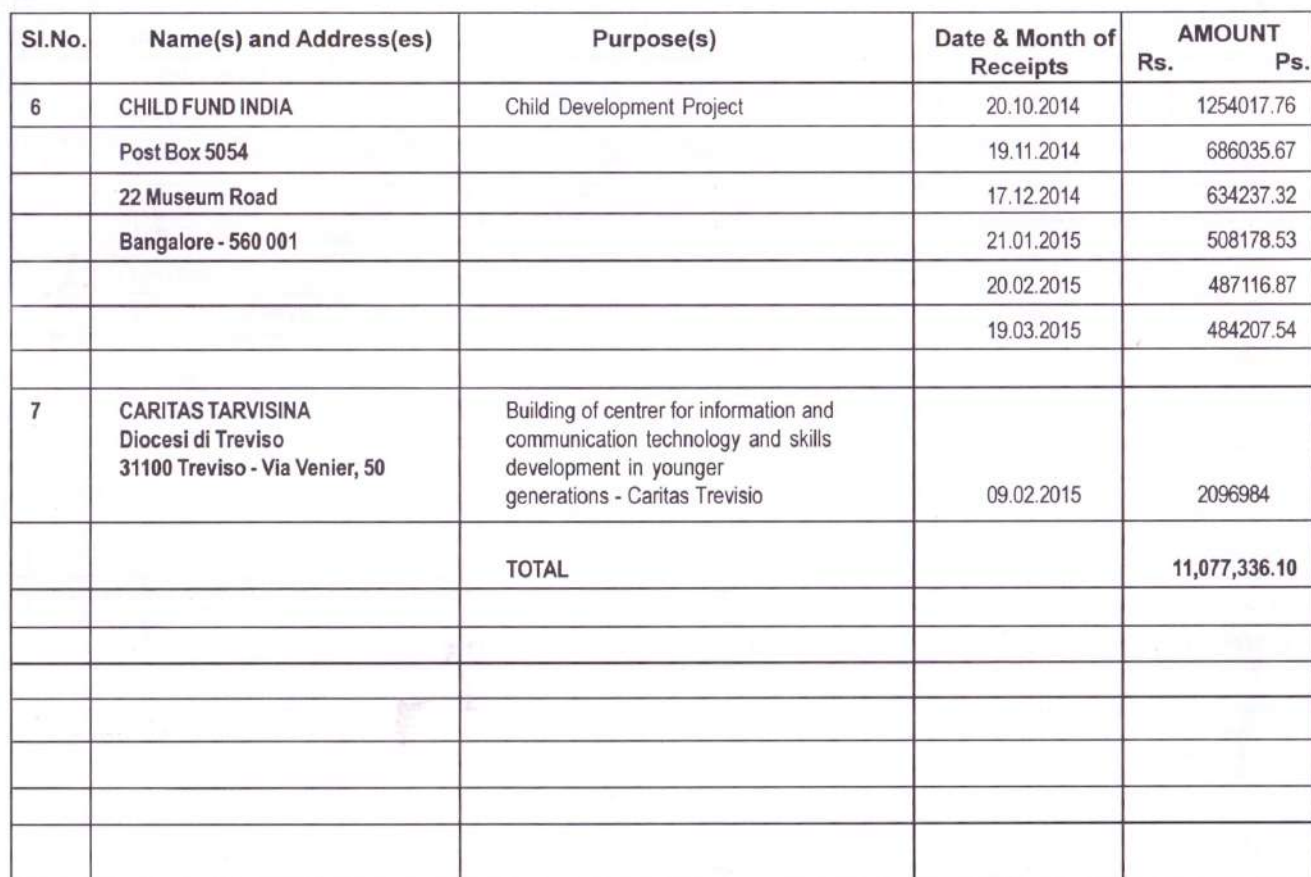

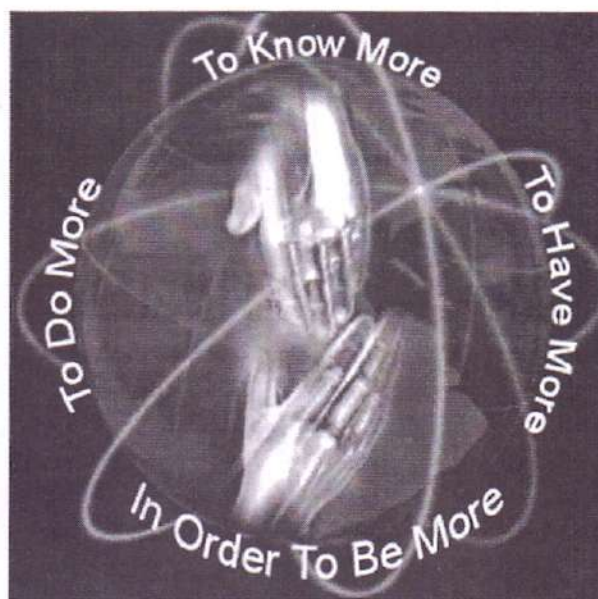
