1. Relief / Education support Activities

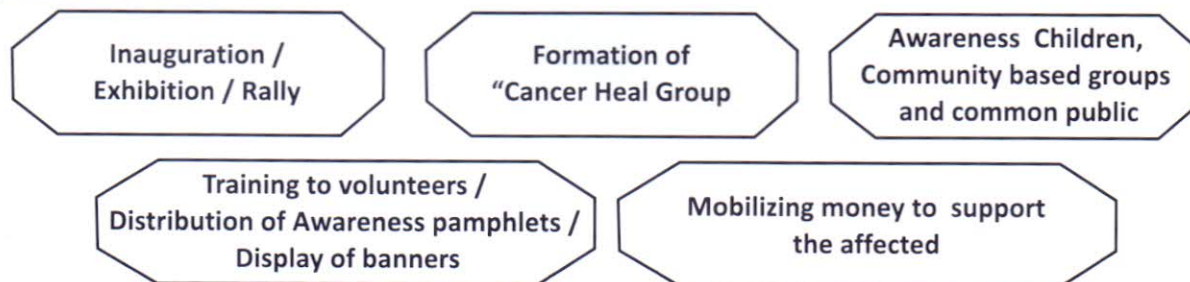
During the reporting period, 3 members received Rs. 3000 to Rs. 5000 as fire relief, in total Rs.12000/- belong to Karunkuzhi, Veerareddikuppam and Cuddalore. Also 4 persons received education assistance from Rs. 1000 to 5000, in total Rs.10000/-



2. EZHUVOM IYAKKAM – CANCER CARE CAMPAIGN

This project is supported by Caritas India and is implemented by PMSSS since January 2020 with the main objective to have **"A COMMUNITY WITHOUT CANCER"** by creating awareness among youth, children and community people and sensitize cancer patients and their relatives on the prevention and supportive systems. In addition to this it is aimed to provide relief and counselling to the cancer affected through single window system.

Significant Events:



Outcomes / Developments:

- 900 persons were provided with awareness on cancer, preventive measures and treatment methods.
- 700 students, parents and volunteers emphasized the impact of cancer and preventive measures among public through a rally.
- An exhibition on cancer was inaugurated by Most. Rev. Dr. Antony Anandarayar, Archbishop of Puducherry and Cuddalore Diocese along with Hon'ble Minister Thiru. M.O.H.F Shajahan, Revenue and Transport Minister, Government of Puducherry followed by a special note on cancer. 900 persons witnessed the exhibition.
- 433 youth club members of Ariyankuppam and Nettapakkam communes and public were provided with awareness on types of cancer, its impact, treatment methods and were also issued awareness pamphlets.
- 151 SHG, agricultural group and Kolping group members of Uluthur, Serathanur, Melpazhanganur and Noorolai were sensitized.
- 95 students of Abishegapakkam high school were sensitized.

3. Livelihood Training Centre :

Livelihood training centre is utilized for the development of various categories of people through multiple trainings. In addition to this, the training centre is utilized to conduct public functions and meetings / trainings.

Outcomes / Developments:

- 78 trainings and meetings were conducted
- 102 celebrations were organized; approximately 350 members access the community hall per celebration.

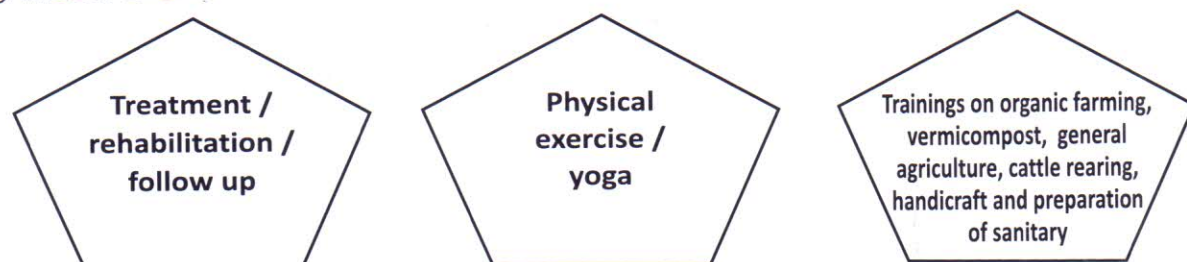

4. Fraternal Life Service Home (FLSH)

Since its inception on 15th August 1983, the home stretches its hands for the treatment and rehabilitation of the mentally ill from the service areas of PMSSS.

Significant Events:



Outcomes / Developments:

- In the reporting year, 203 persons had treatment as outpatients and resumed normal life.
- 9 mentally ill inmates were restored to normal life.
- One person cured of mental illness, got married and is leading a happy life.
- One person cured of mental illness, got employment in a private company.
- 3 persons cured of mental illness, are self-employed and now they are looking after their family.

Case Study :

Shanmugapriya aged 34, hails from Varinjipakkam near Panruti. Her father is Shanmugam and her mother is Saroja. She is a B.A, B.L graduate and aims to become a lawyer. But love failure affected her very much and she became mentally ill. Then she started beating her parents, crying unnecessarily and breaking household things. Without knowing the actual reason behind her daughter's abnormal behaviour they spent a lot of money by selling their lands to treat their daughter through witchcraft. But nothing happened fruitfully. At this juncture, they came to know about PMSSS – FLSH and admitted her in 2013. Since then she was given adequate treatment at JIPMER hospital followed by counselling and other methods for recovery. Now she is back to normal life and got married. She and her parents thanked for the support rendered by the PMSSS Director.

Case Study :

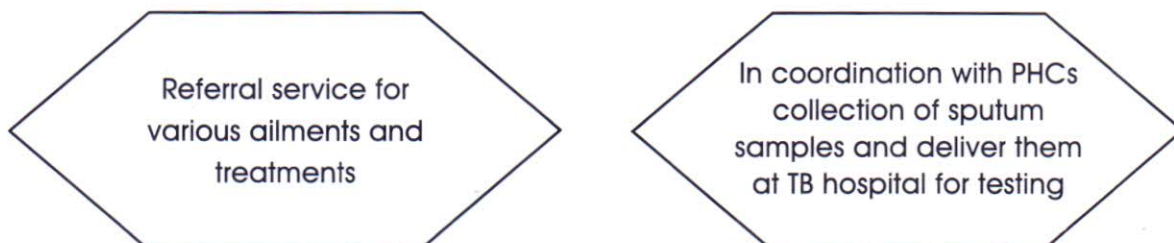
Julier Gandhi, aged 50, is from Thirunelveli. His parents are Subbaiya and Thamizhthai. He did M.Phil and Ph.D. He became mentally ill because of love failure. Then he succumbed to drugs usage and smoking. He used to beat his parents and break household things. He insisted the parents for his marriage and indulged in frequent quarrel with them. On seeing this, his parents admitted him at kilpauk hospital in Chennai for treatment. But he could not come back to normal life. At this situation, they came to know about FLSH and came to Puducherry with recommendation letter from the parish priest of Thirunelveli. They met PMSSS

Director along with Julier Gandhi and the Director facilitated them to get treatment at FLSH. Julier Gandhi underwent regular treatment in JIPMER hospital with counselling and physical exercise. The mental condition of Julier Gandhi started improving, got cured and returned home. Now he is working in a hotel and thanked PMSSS Director for the support which helped him back to normal life.

5. Community Health Program :

The primary focus of this program is to help the people of Puducherry - Cuddalore Diocese and people of other dioceses lead healthy life and providing travelling allowance to the patients in need.

Significant Events:



Outcomes / Developments:

- During this year, 220 persons from 27 parishes got cured of various ailments under general medicine, Neurology, cardiology, paediatric, Gynaecology, eye, ENT, skin and cancer.
- 5 patients from other dioceses like Chidambaram, Devakottai, Dhamapuri and Chengalpattu got cured of their diseases.
- Test for tuberculosis was conducted for 564 persons at 11 PHCs and 24 persons were found positive with tuberculosis and are under continuous treatment.

Total number of recipients : 784

Case study :

Mrs. Rekha, aged 39, belongs to Fathimapalayam. Her husband's name is Natarajan, who is a coolie. They have a son and three daughters. They are very poor. Rekha has a prolonged stomach pain and was getting treatment in her area but there was no improvement in her health condition. At that situation, she met the parish priest of her village, explained her health condition and expressed her inability to spend money for the treatment. On seeing her pathetic condition, the parish priest gave a recommendation letter to the Director of PMSSS. Then she met the Director along with the recommendation letter, The Director was moved with compassion and asked the health coordinator to do the needful. She was admitted in JIPMER hospital and was diagnosed with colorectal problem. She had surgery and returned home. But after few days, again she had stomach pain and admitted at JIPMER hospital.



CT scan and MRI were done, blood samples were collected for testing along with biopsy. The test result revealed that she has colorectal cancer and affected portions were removed through surgery. Then, she became normal and returned home. Rekha and her husband thanked PMSSS Director for the timely help.

Case Study :

Mrs. Arockiaammal aged 25, belongs to Agarakottalam. Her husband Christopher's, job is to harvest sugarcane on daily wages. They have a daughter. Mrs. Arockiaammal had health problem and taken treatment at Kallakurichi private hospital, but there was no improvement in her health condition. At this condition she met a nun of her area and explained about her health issue and inability to meet the medical expenses. The nun gave a recommendation letter to the PMSSS Director. Then, Mrs. Arockiaammal met PMSSS Director and submitted the letter. Considering her health condition PMSSS Director asked the health coordinator to support her for treatment. As a result, CT scan, MRI and blood test were done at JIPMER hospital and found that she has breast cancer and as the result she underwent chemotherapy and necessary treatment for cancer. Then she became normal and returned home. Mrs. Arockiaammal and her husband thanked PMSSS Director for the support rendered.



6. Childline 1098

Responding to emergencies of children below 18 years by physically reach out them and provide care and protection since 2011.

Significant Events:

- On 12th June 2019, Commemoration of World Day against Child Labour was observed and a cycle rally was organized with more than 300 children where the children took oath to eradicate the child labour practice. This event was inaugurated by Thiru. Siva, Member of Legislative Assembly and Tmt. Dr. S. Devipriya, Chairperson (UTPCPCR). The rally started at Gandhi Statue, beach road and concluded at PMSSS office.
- On 13th November 2019, press meet was organized at PMSSS hall and the Director of PMSSS Rev. Fr. C. Joseph Arumaiselvam explained about the activities carried out by PMSSS, sharing the schedule of Dosti campaign and thanked the media persons for the outstanding support towards establishing child protection. Mr. Selvamurugan, Project Manager, ICPS and Mrs. Banumathi, Protection



officer, ICPS were the special invitees and sensitized the gathering on child protection and child rights.

- Selfie with childline frame, a photo awareness event for children was inaugurated by Mr. Maran, Police Superintendent, Mr. Kathirvel, Deputy Inspector and Thiru. Selvam, Sub Instructor. More than 3000 children along with their parents participated and took selfie with childline selfie frame. The children also witnessed a play by social work students and received balloons with childline logo and awareness pamphlet.

Outcomes / Developments:

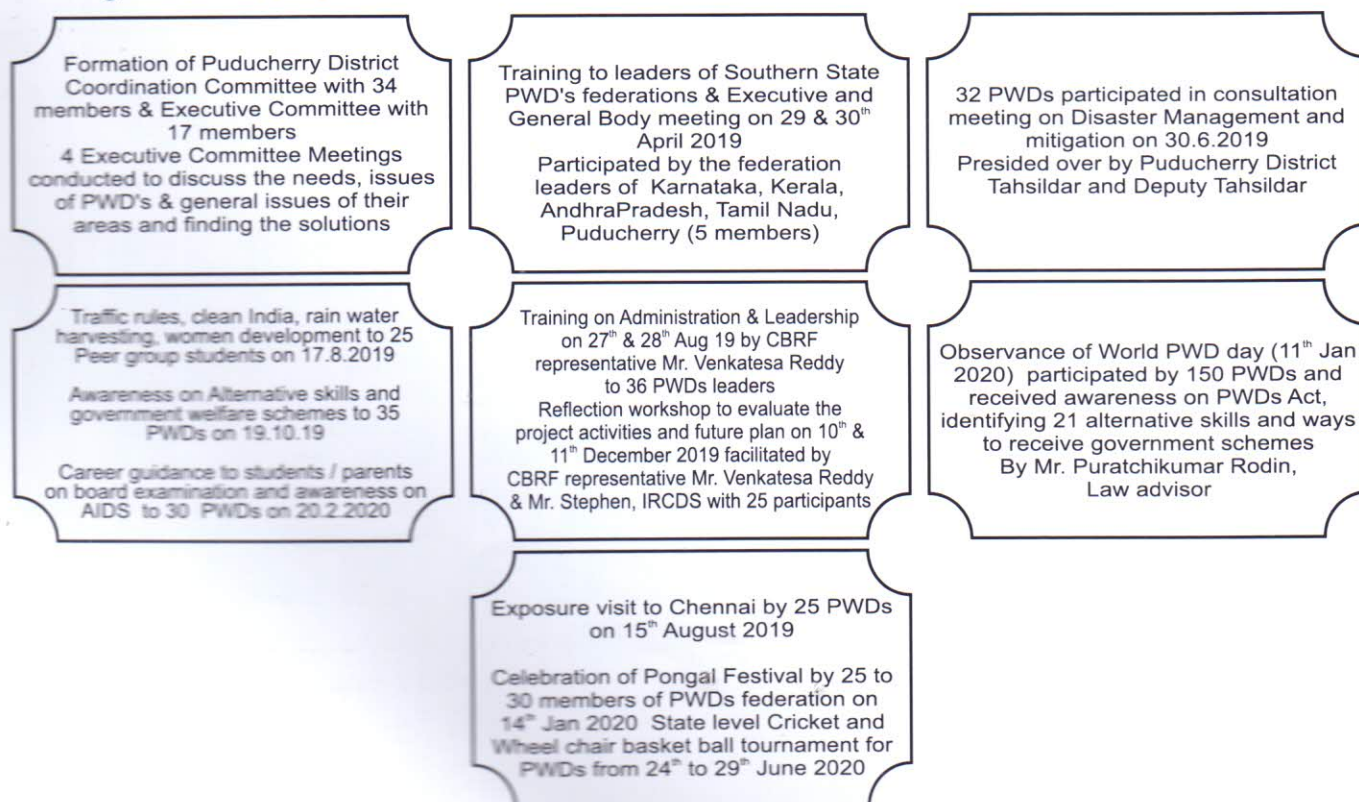
- During this reporting year 1690 calls were received where rescue, protection, multiple assistance, counselling and facilitation was done for children in emergencies.
- 438 children received assistance from police, social welfare department, women and child development, education, labour, finance departments especially child welfare committee and Juvenile Justice Board.
- 10176 anganwadi teachers, school children, members of community based organizations and general public participated and received awareness on child rights and child protection laws.

Total number of recipients : 42,394

7. CI-CBRF DPO PROJECT :

PMSSS in collaboration with Collective Action For Basic Rights Foundation (CBRF) is implementing this program for the past 7 years at 3 communes of Villianur, Bahour & Mandipet of Puducherry district. This program envisages to work with individual people with disabilities and their families to lift the barriers (attitudinal, institutional, information, communication, physical) that prevents the participation of persons with disabilities as equals.

Outcomes / Developments:

- 399 persons with disabilities received wheel chair, tri cycle, walking stick, crutches, spectacles, wrist watches, teaching learning materials as free assistance under Puducherry government welfare schemes and finance assistance from legislative and parliament members. In addition to this, 10 persons received fuel subsidy and 45 persons received disability certificate.
- 2 differently abled male married normal (without disability) women and lead a happy life
- Mr. Karthikeyan, selected as the best community activist by CBRF and received Samarthiya award at the ceremony held in Bangalore on 7th of March 2020.
- As a result of participating in group meetings, the members are able to understand commune panchayat & district level issues and gained capacity to make draft plan.
- The members identified 16 issues, able to solve them and had benefits with the support of Puducherry government officials
- 6 differently abled persons are included in Puducherry social welfare advisory committee
- 2 shops allotted to 9 differently abled persons to sell their handmade phenyl, soap oil, dish wash powder, incense stick, frankincense. In addition to these, they do chair caning. They earn Rs. 15,000 per month through selling the products.

- The places used most by the PWDs like public places, institutions and voting booths were provided with sufficient facilities after several petitions.
- A toll free no. for PWDs provided by the Government of Puducherry during disasters.

Project assessment & Discussion:

- ❖ On 2nd & 3rd, April, 2019, CBRF representative Mr. Stephen evaluated the project activities and its outcome. Then he had discussion with the team to prepare action plan for the next year.
- ❖ Executive Director of PMSSS and project coordinator participated in stakeholders meeting in Kolkatta on 10th & 11th of June 2019 and shared the progress of project activities

Total number of recipients : 6260

Case study :

Mr. G. Karthikeyan, aged 37 lives in Bahour of Puducherry District. He is visually impaired since childhood. He had surgery when he was young and gained eye sight to some extent. He did regular schooling till 12th grade and now doing B.A (Sociology) through distance education. He married a normal woman (without disability) in 2007 and has two sons. He is very much interested in the



development of PWDs. In 2004 he started a SHG for PwD and then in 2005 he started a forum called Viduthalai Matruthiranaligal development society. He is supporting PWDs through forum in many ways. He joined as a member in the group initiated by PMSSS - CBRF and later became the leader of the same group. In 2012 CBRF has started a project for mainstreaming PwDs and Mr. Karthikeyan developed various skills through this project. By acquiring various skills he has started a trust "Sathiyam matruthiranaligal community development" and the same was registered in the year 2017. Then he became the leader of Puducherry district level PWD federation. He always fights for the rights of PwD and has staged dharna to get welfare schemes and ensure the rights of PwDs with the support of the Government. Through his trust, he has supported 570 PwDs for job opportunities and livelihood development. He won the best social worker award for his outstanding contribution towards the development of PwDs.

Case study :

Mr. Balaji, aged 29, hails from Puducherry. He was affected by polio when he was six month old and had surgery for the defect and was healed to some extent. He is a diploma holder and running a mobile service shop. In addition to this he is talented in yoga and dance. He drives an auto rickshaw too. He is a member of PWD group initiated by



PMSSS – CBRF and regularly participated in all skill development trainings and DPO meetings. He also participated in cultural events organized by the actor Ragava Lawrence and Elvin PwD cultural team and earns income. He owns an auto rickshaw and gets income from it. As a member of Puducherry district level PWD federation, he works for the welfare of PWDs. In 2019, he married a normal woman (without disability). Now he is able to get an income of Rs. 10,000 per month through cultural activities and auto rickshaw. He also support PwDs through his service and lives happily.

8. Child Development Project:

Child Development Project is implemented by PMSSS with the support of Child Fund India (CFI) since 2014 in 14 villages of Ariyankuppam and Nettapakkam communes of Puducherry district. During 2019-2020, livelihood, child protection and sponsor relation activities were carried out for 263 project children and 1580 children in the service areas. The staff were given training by CFI on regular basis to execute the activities.

Significant Events:

- Under livelihood project, 52 youth received various skill trainings such as type writing, competitive coaching class, online spoken English class, four wheeler training and tally course. 120 children aware on education group wise career opportunities and related higher studies. 44 children each received educational scholarship assistance of Rs. 1000 to Rs. 2000. 123 youth participated in the life skill trainings and 181 youth aware on PRI, RTE, RTI and government schemes through meetings.
- 60 youth participated in EDP program and learnt business strategies and government schemes for entrepreneurs. 2 youth each received business assistance of Rs. 2000 to setup DTP shop.
- 80 youth club office bearers and members were sensitized on club bye laws and to register in NYK. Youth club members participated in grama sabha meetings during the months of August 2019 & January 2020 and submitted petitions for the social issues.
- 58 youth club office bearers and members had exposure visit to Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur and learnt about various topics in life skill education and national youth policy.
- Rev. Fr. C. Joseph Arumaiselvam, Chief Functionary, unveiled the awareness on flex banner on plastic free environment at 5 villages.



- The members of 14 youth clubs at service areas created COVID 19 awareness in the community through door to door campaign, sprayed herbal and chemical sanitizers and asked the community members to follow the government guidelines to safe guard them from COVID 19 infection.
- Under child protection program, 110 village level child protection committee members trained on JJ Act, care and protection of children from 0 to 18 yrs, roles and responsibilities of the VLCPC, Prevention mechanism, POCSO Act, punishments to the offenders, reporting mechanism such as complaints, Puducherry DCPC roles in child protection. Also discussed about protection slogan "ABCD " for the children: A- Alert, B-Bold, c-caution, D- don't allow, E-express. Mr. Selvamurugan, Program Officer, DCPU (District Child Protection Unit) and protection officer, Mrs. Banumathi (women & children development) sensitized the members.
- 651 government school children aware on child rights, good and bad touch, child protection issues, prevention mechanism and ABCD protection slogan. 60 persons attended village legal aid camp and aware on basic legal rights and scheme of legal authority service and did vulnerable children mapping assessment at village level to identify children issues.

- The communications from project children to their sponsors sent on time to the CFI zonal office.
- 40 persons benefited by government welfare scheme / assistance like marriage assistance, subsidy for housing construction, chief minister's medical assistance and old age pension card.
- 17 youth, received free sewing training, beautician course, aya work, bridal dress stitching, hand sketch with the support of other NGOs/ agencies/institutions.
- 30 project children received education scholarship from Rs. 2000/- to Rs.5000/- from Vasavi and Vanitha trust. The trust had given away Rs.1,03,000/- in total , distributed by the chief functionary in the presence of key members of the trust.

Field visit by CFI Zonal office representatives:

- Mr. Antony Raj, SR associate, CFI zonal office, visited the project office from 23rd to 25th of September 2019. He had discussion with the chief functionary, project team, verified children files, DFC process followed, did house visit and discussed with 15 project children and their parents.

Case study :

Child Durga S (100004735/00075) benefitted by Child Development Project for nearly 20 years. She is from Thavalakuppam village where most of the people depend on daily waged work for their livelihood. Their income is irregular, mainly seasonal work. Her father Supparayan is a coolie and earns very poor income. Her mother Santhi is a house wife. Durga's younger sister is Hemalatha.



Her father's income is not sufficient to meet out even the basic needs of the family and struggled a lot to provide education for the children. At this juncture, through field staff, the parents came to know about the sponsorship program for the needy children. They approached the project and enrolled Durga for sponsorship. Then Durga got sponsored and received the support of sponsor and the project.

Durga is very good in studies and grabbed the opportunity well. Her sister too was good in studies. Durga and her family members benefitted through various awareness programs conducted by the project. Her community also benefitted through various awareness and health programs. She was a volunteer in child resource centre supported by the project. At CRC, she helped the children in their studies and extracurricular activities. Durga has completed master's degree in Mathematics and bachelor's degree in education and now she is a teacher in a private school. The income from her job supports her and her family. Her sister also has completed bachelor's degree in nursing and looking for job. Durga and her parents thanked CFI and PMSSS for the support received and for attaining development in their life.

Case study:



Mugunthan (100020482/00777) of Pooranankuppam, is a sponsored child of the project for 13 years. His father Murugaiyan and his mother Meera are agricultural coolies. His village is basically agricultural based and most of the villager's income is from agricultural coolie work. But mainly seasonal work. His elder brother is Vasanthan. His parents were worrying a lot since their income was not enough to educate their children and bear the minimum needs of the family. At this juncture they came to know about the sponsorship program through neighbor. They met the project head and explained their family condition and seeking support to educate their children. The project made necessary assessment and found that the child fulfilled the selection criteria. Then Mugunthan was enrolled in the project and got sponsorship.

Mugunthan progressed well in studies and has just completed bachelor's degree in catering and looking for job. Mugunthan and his family members benefitted by the project through various awareness programs. He is an active member of youth in his village, initiated by the project. He has developed leadership qualities and decision making by addressing social issues along with other members of the club. He had an opportunity for four wheeler driving training and got license supported by the project. This is an additional skill for him, a support for livelihood. Now he earns something as a part time driver. Through this income he is able look after his needs and family needs to some extent. He is also planning to own a car in the future.

Mugunthan thanked CFI, sponsor and PMSSS for the support rendered so far to see a bright future and do well in all efforts he has taken. His parents are also very happy that their son got an overall development through this project.

- Under collective IGP, 15 members of Sowbaghya group do milk vending and earn Rs. 2250 per month whereas 20 members of Annai Theresa group do egg wholesale business and earn Rs. 6100 per month.
- 18 members each earns Rs. 3500 per month through milch animal
- 16 children of kolping group members continue higher studies with the support of vocational skill training assistance. Children of four members have completed their education, out of which one person works in a private company and getting Rs. 8000 per month as salary.
- Under SAP, 20 members constructed toilets, using it and prevented from diseases and women avoided open defecation.
- Under home building scheme, 2 members have completed house construction and construction of houses of 2 members is under progress.

Case study :

Mrs. Sagayarani, aged 49 belongs to Sathamampattu. Her husband is Mr. Rajarathinam. She has two sons doing 11th grade and bachelor's degree respectively in English medium. Due to her poor economic condition, she could not pay school fees for the children and meet family needs. At this juncture, she joined in St. Pauls kolping group and got loan of Rs. 30,000. But she could not repay the loan and as per the guidance from project coordinator she participated in the training for Entrepreneurs. Then she has decided to buy a milch animal and to do milk vending with the knowledge she gained from the training. She submitted loan application in the group and got loan, where Rs. 20,000 as Kolping



India assistance and Rs. 15000 as group loan. The milch animal yields 7 litres per day from which she sells 6 litres and utilizes 1 litre for their use. In average she sells 180 litres of milk per month and earns RS. 33 per litre and per month she earns Rs. 6000 as average income. Out of Rs. 6000 income per month, she gets Rs. 4600 as net profit

while the rest of amount is spent for feed and other expenses. This income helps her to meet her children's education expenses and to repay the loan promptly. She plans to buy another milch animal. She thanked Kolping India and PMSSS for the development in her life.

Case study :

Mr. Pushparaj, aged 26 lives at Agarakottalam. He is doing 2nd year Bachelor of Computer Application. His father Mr. Benjamin, is a coolie and his mother is a house wife and a member in Annai Theresa kolping group. His sister is doing 9th grade. The poor economic condition prevented his 3rd year studies. Under this circumstance he had applied for loan under kolping vocational skill training assistance. Then he received Rs. 20,000 assistance from Kolping India and completed his final year bachelor's degree. Now he is working in a private flour mill at Chinnasalem. He is getting Rs. 8000 per month and is able to support the family to some extent. Now his family relieved from economic problem to some extent, lives happily. He thanked Kolping India and PMSSS for the support rendered.



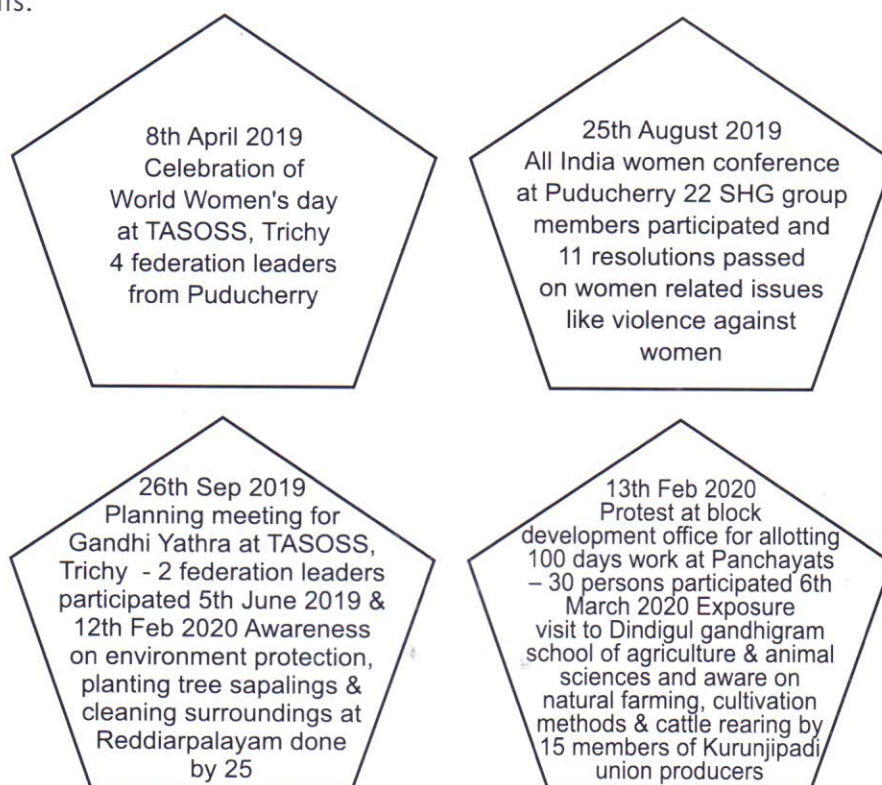
11. New Thrust Programme:

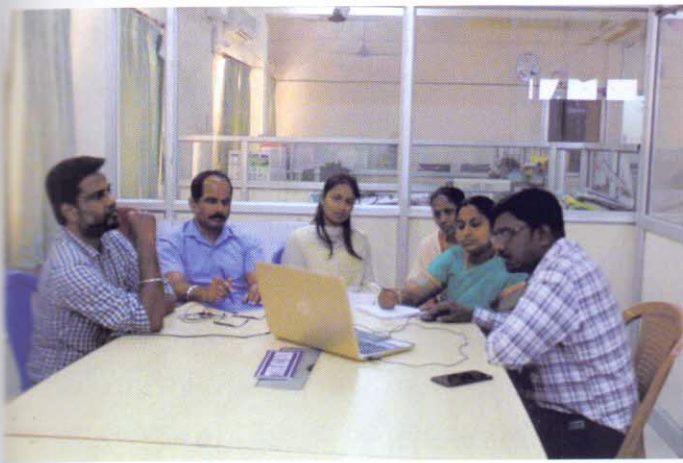

Outcomes / Developments:

- 23 members of 5 unions belong to Cuddalore and Puducherry districts received Rs. 98,98,138 from ICICI bank and 3 group members of 2 unions received Rs. 30,00,000 as loan from other banks to start trades.

- As a result of the awareness on government schemes, one person received assistance for poultry farm, 25 persons received free toilet construction assistance, 305 person received assistance for soak pit installation, 30 persons received free goat rearing assistance and 2 persons received subsidy for house construction.
- In 2019 – 20 Panchayat Raj election, 62 CBOs members and their family members contested and 55 persons won in the election.
- 5 children of CBO members were facilitated to join nursing course
- 2 children received educational assistance from Puducherry Adidraavidar Welfare department.
- As an outcome of the effort taken by the Reddiarpalayam village committee leader, 15 CBO members got appointment as sanitary workers in Uzhavarkarai Municipality and one person as office security. In cuddalore district, 6 CBO members got placement as sanitary workers under Swatch Bharat scheme.
- The cadres and group members participated in the grama sabha meetings at panchayat level as a result of continuous facilitation. Especially, the cadres of panapakkam along with village people staged protest and got drinking water facility at houses, road facility between Panapakkam to Pudupet and access to cemetery.
- The impact of protest by CBOs along with general public : overhead tank, underground sump and ritual shed at Rayarpalayam. In Puducherry, renovation of canals & water bodies and removal of road side encroachment. CBO members as volunteer to administer polio drops,

Case study :

Mrs. S. Amudha, aged 43, lives in Aathirkuppam village of Cuddalore District. Her husband due to poor health condition, is unable to go for job. She has two sons. She works in a cashew nut processing industry on daily wages. But the income is not sufficient to meet out basic needs of the family. She has joined as a member in Mullaimalar mahalir SHG initiated by PMSSS in 2009. Later she became the representative of the group and now she is the motivator of the group. She participated in the livelihood enhancement training organized by PMSSS NTP project for the marginalized people. Then with the facilitation of PMSSS she got a loan of Rs. 30,000 from Pallavan Bank and



bought a cashew processing machine. Through this machine she is able to process 45 kgs of cashews per day and earns Rs. 20 per kg and in total Rs.900 per day. She also purchased two goats to enhance the income when there is no cashew processing work. Now the two goats multiplied to ten goats. She sold few goats and purchased a milch animal, to do milk vending and he is getting additional income. Now she has recovered from her poor economic condition and is able to meet the necessary needs from her income and lives happily.

Case study :

Mrs. Sagayamary, aged 42, belongs to Vadalur of Cuddalore District. Her husband is Mr. Amalorpavaraj. She has a daughter and 2 sons. Her husband works in film industry without regular income. Hence, she suffered a lot to educate the children and for family needs. Mrs. Sagayamary, knows tailoring and earns something from it. Facilitated by PMSSS – NTP project, she has started Thendral women SHG in her place and guides the group as the leader. Later she became the secretary of Kurunjipadi Union Federation and



acting excellently. At this juncture, she participated in the livelihood enhancement training organized by the project for the marginalized people. She learnt embroidery, bridal blouse, ariya work and beautician through this training. After this training, she stitches bridal blouses at her area and also does bridal make up and gets income. She also stitch dress and sells materials required for embroidery, ariya work, lace varieties and cosmetics in a rented building. This income helps her to support children studies and meet family needs.

12. Usha Silai school :

PMSSS with the support of Usha International Ltd., New Delhi, is implementing Usha Silai School project in the districts of Puducherry, Cuddalore and Villupuram since 2014, to improve the living condition and livelihood of the women with basic tailoring skills and there by transforming them as women entrepreneurs.

During the year 2019 – 2020, 1082 women from Puducherry, Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts completed tailoring training through Usha Silai School, through PMSSS.

On 16th May 2019, at PMSSS training centre 14 Usha Silai school teachers had training to prepare attendance sheet for trainees at Silai School, monthly income of the silai school teachers and related information through mobile app in the future.



On 21st June 2019, at PMSSS training centre, Executive Director of PMSSS distributed course completed certificates to 20 women who completed the tailoring training.

Master trainer Mrs. Kalaiselvi, trained 20 women to start new Usha silai schools. This training was conducted in the areas of Thiruvannamalai and Permabalur districts from 8th to 24th November 2019. The duration of the training was 7 days per district and Mrs. Kalaiselvi received Rs. 9800 as training fee.



On 24th January 2020, at PMSSS training centre, an assessment was done to select 15 master trainers. 17 women participated in this assessment and exhibited their tailoring skills. The assessment was conducted by Mr. Vadivelan Perumal, Coordinator of Usha International Ltd.,

Case study :

Mrs. Suganthy, aged 38, lives in Theedir Nagar of Villupuram district. She is from economically poor background. She has completed 10th grade and learnt 6 months tailoring course. She got married in the year 2001 and her husband is Mr. Sendhilkumar. Suganthy has two daughters, the elder daughter has completed 12th grade and applied for degree course and the younger one is doing 10th grade. Mr. Sendhilkumar is an electrician by profession. He gets only 15 days of work in a month and that too is not regular. In addition to this he does painting work. In an average he gets Rs. 500 per day when he goes to job. Suganthy finds in difficulty to run the family and educate her children



with the limited income. So she worked in a tailoring shop on daily wages. At this juncture, she came to know about PMSSS – USHA silai school through one of the teachers of silai school in Puducherry. She had 7 days residential training at PMSSS training centre, Puducherry. Through this training she learnt about the types of blouse, chudithar through paper pattern and cutting methods, embroidery and sewing machine repair techniques. After the completion of the training, she got USHA tailoring machine and advertisement board and established USHA silai school at her residence on 5th January 2015 inaugurated by Executive Director of PMSSS. So far 87 women completed tailoring course through her school. She charges Rs. 500 to 750 per month as course fee for a student. Now she earns Rs. 6000 to Rs. 10000 per month through stitching and course fee. Mrs. Suganthy now able to save something from the earnings and able to manage the school needs, children's education and family needs, even without the income from her husband, she can manage her basic needs through silai school income.

While talking about the silai school ; "the silai school improved my life standard and brought dignity in my life. My children and my husband too supported me and motivated me. She thanked wholeheartedly PMSSS and USHA International Ltd for providing this wonderful opportunity to have a bright future"

Case study :

Mrs. Magimaimary, aged 42 years, lives in M. Parur of Virudhachalam block in Villupuram District. She hails from a poor family. She studied upto 10th grade and learnt 6 months tailoring course. She got married in the year 1999. Her husband Mr. John Christuraj, is a casual labour and a painter. Her husband could earn only a meagre income through this job. As Mrs. Magimaimary knows tailoring already she stitches dress of neighbours and earns little income, which is not sufficient to meet basic needs. She has three sons where the first one is doing 3rd year BBA, the second one is doing 12th grade and the third one is doing 9th grade.



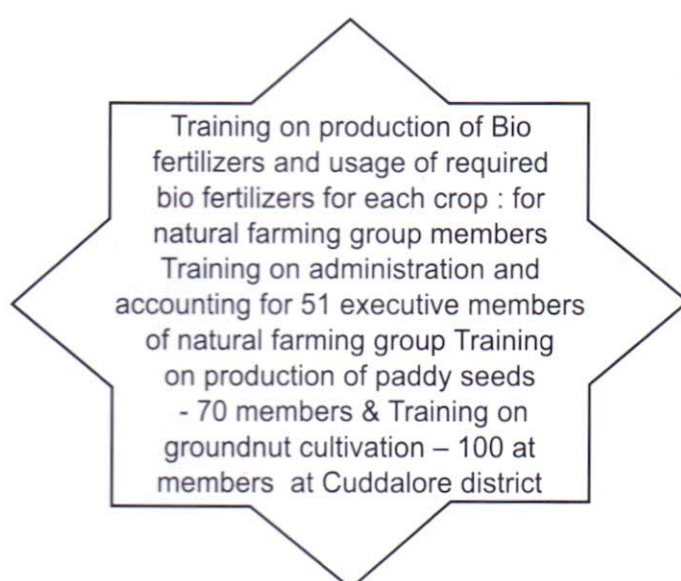
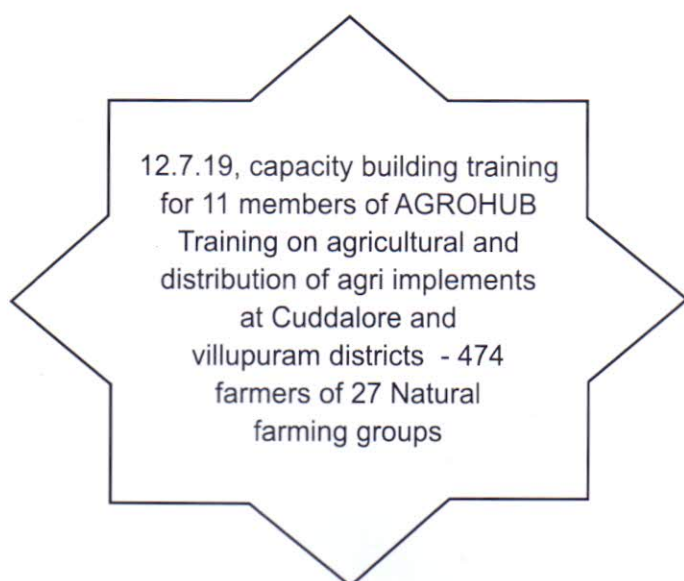
PMSSS circulated information to the churches coming under its service areas about Usha Silai school. The Priest of the church shared this message during Sunday mass. After hearing this she came to Puducherry and joined 7 days residential training conducted at PMSSS training centre, Puducherry. Through this training she learnt about the types of blouse, chudithar through paper pattern and cutting methods, embroidery and sewing machine service techniques. After the completion of the training, she got USHA tailoring machine, certificate, advertisement board and established USHA silai school at her residence on 3rd March 2016. So far 23 women completed tailoring course through her school. She charges Rs. 500 as course fee per month. Now she earns Rs. 6000 to Rs. 8000 per month through stitching and course fee. Through this income she is able to run the school, educate the children and meet the family needs without borrowing.

Mrs. Magimaimary says, silai school improved my knowledge on tailoring, receive income and also gained confidence to face the life without fear. Her family members are also supporting and motivating her to run the school. She thanked PMSSS and USHA International Ltd., for showing a good path for happy life.

13. Empowering Small and Marginal Farmers for Enhanced household Income and Food Security – Manos Unidas, Spain :

This project is aimed to uplift the life standards of small and marginal farmers in the rural areas especially for the farmers of Aathirikuppam, Siluvaipalayam, Manapudur, Keezhakollai and Sirugiramam in Cuddalore District, similarly in Villupuram District covering the villages Melpazhangur, Porbalampattu, Thondananthal, Noorolai and Maiyanur by attaining increased agricultural production, value added products, marketing linkages and marketing agricultural products.

ICT project is aimed to support the youth to enhance their skills beyond their basic qualification with the support of State, Central and private institutions to have livelihood trainings and there by getting jobs.

National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL)

Based on the agreement between PMSSS and NSDL, the youth are trained on PAN CARD and related service through digital with the support of Edujob academy. 90 students were trained and 24 youth received job.



Minimum Payment course :

PMSSS provides trainings to expose individual talents and related job opportunities with minimum payment. During this reporting period, 80 persons received tailoring training at Vadalur and 60 persons received tailoring training at Thavalakuppam. In addition to this 20 received computer training and 1 person received photoshop training.

Production of cotton bag :

The tailoring unit staff stitched 1000 cotton bags with the support of TamilNadu Grama Bank, Salem branch and Rs. 1500 was got through sales.

Ms. K. Venmani, is from Puducherry. Her father is Mr. Kumar, runs a tea shop. He is a differently abled person. Her mother is Mrs. Gomathi @ lakshmi, looks after the family and an auto driver, earning a minimum income. Her sister is K. Leelavathi doing 11th grade. Venmani has completed 12th grade and applied for B.Sc (Statistics) in Puducherry University. But she could not get it and joined B.Sc (Computer science) in Bharathidasan Government Women's College. She is interested to work in bank and government services. She came to know about NSDL course implemented by PMSSS. Then, she joined and completed Business correspondent / business facilitator course. She feels that this qualification would be a great support for life development and to improve her skills. She requested PMSSS to introduce courses like this to youth for good future.

15. Women and Children development Project, AWWY – Belgium

Women and children development project supported by AWWAY (A Way With You), Belgium is implemented in Mathur, Kadaperikuppam and Vazhudalampet villages of Cuddalore District in Tamil Nadu. The project helps the marginalized children have enhanced knowledge and supports the rural women through skill training.

Significant Events:

- Evening tuition for students with nutritious supplement
- Tailoring training for women
- Distribution of dry ration to marginalized families

Outcomes/Developments

- 85 students of Mathur and Vazhuthalampattu villages were benefitted through evening tuition
